PSHE and Citizenship is taught for one each week by their form tutors.

PSHE stands for:

'Personal, Social, Health and Economics Education'.

Within the PSHE SOW we now teach economic wellbeing and financial capability. This non-statutory programme of study brings together careers education, work-related learning, enterprise and financial capability.

PSHE will help learners become confident, healthy and independent individuals. The framework has three elements:

1.

- Developing confidence and responsibilities and making the most of their abilities.
- Developing healthy lifestyle
- Developing good relationships and respecting the differences between people.

2. The **citizenship** element is designed to help learners become active, informed citizens and confident, responsible members of society. This has three elements:

- Knowledge and understanding about becoming informed citizens.
- Developing skills of enquiry and communication.
- Developing skills of participation and responsible action.

3. The careers element to year 7 PSHE covers self development, career exploration and skills needed to access and make effective use of careers guidance.
