What Can A Parent Do?

- Parental support is 8 times more important in determining a child's academic success than social class. The Campaign for Learning found that parental involvement in a child's education can mean the difference between an A* and an 'also-ran' at GCSE.
- The good news is that you don't need to be an expert in any of the subjects your child chooses to make a real difference
- Your support, encouragement and interest can make a spectacular difference to your child's motivation and ability to cope with the academic and organisational demands of the exam period

Having an impact

- Attendance – direct link between attendance and attainment
- Punctuality – lateness = lost learning
- Progress Evenings – find out from teaching staff what your child needs to do to succeed Thursday 11th December 2014
- Encourage use of Sam Learning, My Maths etc
- Keep in touch – check progress regularly
